

Pastor's Musings

The season of Easter concludes with Pentecost, which was May 23rd of this year. Pentecost is celebrated 50 days after Easter Sunday and it is a celebration of the Holy Spirit pouring itself out onto many who were gathered together, observing the traditional Jewish festival of Weeks. This crowd had gathered from at least 15 different countries, and as you can imagine, there were many different native languages, so basic communication was a challenge. As the Holy Spirit poured itself onto the people, they were able to understand one another despite the many different languages they spoke. Despite that ability to understand, there were some in the crowd that were suspicious and skeptical. They wondered if the crowd was drunk on new wine early in the morning. Thank goodness the disciple Peter was able to call out the skeptics and remind them that the prophet Joel had indeed predicted that the Holy Spirit would empower the people to see visions and dream dreams. With Peter's guidance our scriptures tell us that the crowd of believes grew significantly.

I believe the Holy Spirit continues to be poured out on ourselves today, Pentecost was not just a one-time event. This presence allows the prophet Joel's words to continue to be true in our world today. Our sons and daughters continue to prophesy, our young men and women see visions and our elders dream dreams. Our faith and how it is lived out within our congregation is not static, it needs to adapt and be responsive to the world in which we live, that is where the Holy Spirit comes in and inspires those dreams and visions. The Holy Spirit is alive and well in our world. The question is; How receptive are we to the dreams and visions that the Holy Spirit is sharing? Are we skeptics who dismiss the radical new visions and dreams as simply the result of too much early morning wine? Or are we open to the possibilities of what the Holy Spirit might be calling us to do in new directions and new methods? If indeed we dismiss the Holy Spirit as the influence of intoxication, then our community will remain static as the world moves around us. On the other hand, if we embrace the Holy Spirit's stirrings, then our faith will remain relevant to the world in which we live. Come Holy Spirit Come, stir within us, open us to the radical possibilities, the dreams, the visions of what Pentecost can mean in our lives today.

Please let Char Gumm know what you are able to donate to this meal by Sunday June 20, her number is 467-6670. Thank you for your help.


