

Cherry Bread Pudding

1 loaf French bread cut into cubes, sprinkle with 1 T cinnamon, 1/4 cup brown sugar and 1/4 tsp nutmeg. Grease 9 x 13 pan and layer 1/2 of bread cubes in pan. 1 can cherry pie filling and spoon 1/2 of can onto bread cubes, repeat layers. Mix together 5 eggs, 2 Cups milk, 1 tsp. cinnamon, 1/2 Cup sugar, 1 tsp. vanilla, 1/2 cup melted butter. Pour over bread cubes. Top with 3/4 Cup Chocolate Chips. Make sure all bread cubes are in the liquid. Bake 350 degrees for 1 hour. Cool and top with a 3oz box of vanilla pudding mixed with 2 1/2 Cups milk to make a soft custard, pour over the top of bread pudding and serve with cool whip. Very Delicious
